1	Title: Fiction Writing		
2	Learning Objectives: 2.1 To study the form and structure of screenplays through existing films and scripts.		
	2.2 To enable students to write through short exercises of scripts and gradually build towards longer ones.		
3	Learning Outcomes: 3.1 Throughout the course, the students will be writing loglines, expanding it into a synopsis, and create characters that will interact to form a short film. They will also secondarily write, shoot, and edit a scene to demonstrate basic filmmaking techniques.		
4	Description The aim is to shatter the mental barrier of new writers by making them actually work on an idea of their own, resulting in them becoming more confident and experienced in writing in this format. This course can be expanded into writing a feature film, or a pilot, in the future depending on student's individual work.

Week 1: - Screenplay Format + Nailing the Pitch

- What is a film: Understanding vocabulary and grammar of cinema?
- Screenwriting: Format + Approach
- Loglines and elevator pitches: the high-concept logline.
- Formula for a logline. Breaking down popular films into loglines.
- Exercise- Write a logline.
- The Pitch document: logline + synopsis + characters.
- <u>Exercise</u>- Conceptualizing short films

Week 2: Characters + Scenes

- What is drama? Plot vs Story
